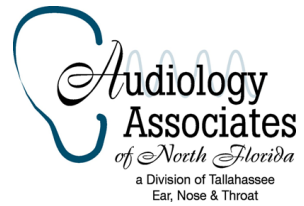

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## **BONE ANCHORED HEARING DEVICE**

Your physician recommended a bone anchored hearing device as an option to help with your hearing loss. A bone anchored device is a device that uses vibrations in the skull to transmit sound to the inner ear, bypassing the outer and middle ear.

### **What are the steps for determining candidacy for a bone anchored hearing device and for scheduling a bone anchored surgery?**

1. Initial appointment with an ENT physician
2. Audiologic evaluation (hearing test)
3. Bone anchored consultation (and consultation for any other recommended options) with an Audiologist as well as take-home demo
4. Follow-up appointment with the Audiologist and return demo device(s)
5. ENT follow-up and sign surgical consents.
6. Schedule your surgery

\*All steps must be met for bone anchored hearing device surgery to be scheduled. Most bone anchored devices and fees are covered by insurance – subject to insurance company.

### **What are the steps for the post-surgical follow-up process?**

1. First post-op visit with your ENT
2. Second post-op visit with your ENT (typically 1 – 3 months following surgery)
3. Fitting appointment with your Audiologist for programming when medically cleared by ENT
4. Continued care for your bone anchored device with your Audiologist
